

The DeKalb County Builders Association has asked to speak at the first meeting in November. Mayor Stokes agreed.

A business in the Industrial area has been leaving work vehicles and trailers parked on Ellwalk Avenue that is causing problems for traffic and a potential safety hazard for emergency vehicles. On the Mayor's authority, Chief Dargis has posted no parking signs along the west side of the road and has had several discussions with the owner who has not been cooperative in the Chief's efforts to clear the street. Mayor Stokes and Chief Dargis would like Stephanie Road, Ellwalk Avenue, and Halwood Street to become a no parking zone between 2:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. The consensus of the Board was to agree with this proposal. An ordinance will be prepared and brought forward for approval at the October 26 Town Board meeting.

During this discussion a question regarding town-wide parking restrictions was mentioned, the consensus was to start with streets in this industrial area only.

Mayor Stokes and Trustee Lanning would like to honor Cody Owen, a Cortland resident, who at age 24 passed away from medical complications due to his battle with cancer. Cody accomplished so much in his short life, including becoming an Eagle Scout at age 15. He was very active in this community and so well liked by everyone who knew him. It is for his many accomplishments that at the first board meeting in December a proclamation honoring Cody will be presented, and the Scouting Bridge at Cortland Community Park will be dedicated to his memory.
