**President's Report**

Mayor Stokes reported that he, Director Kocher, Engineer Carmichael and the County engineer Nathan Schwartz have met to begin discussions on much needed improvements for Somonauk Rd. north to Cortland Center Rd. and the possibility of installing sidewalks along the east side Somonauk Rd. to Meadow at NeuCort Lakes, and the possibility of the Town taking over Maintenance of the road improvements in the future.

[As part of the Town of Cortland's 150 year celebration, a time capsule is being buried at Cortland Community Park following this year's Annual Parade. The capsule is being donated to the Town by Mayor Russ Stokes and his wife, Ginny.]

Mayor Stokes reported that the time capsule has been ordered and will be ready for burying items on October 11, 2015 at Cortland Community Park after the parade. The public works department will prepare the ground for the burial of the time capsule. This is a 50 year capsule and not to be opened until 2065. The contents of the Time Capsule will serve to tell the story of what the Town of Cortland is like today to future generations of our residents.

Officer Roy Garcia is working with department heads in preparing the town's emergency preparedness plan as part of the National Incident Management Systems (NIMS) requirements. Officer Garcia has vast knowledge of preparing these types of plans and has done so for state universities.
